Is Jesus a Democrat or a Republican? Now that I have your attention, ask yourself; do I find the question ridiculous and/or offensive? Do you think that your political party's ideas align more closely with the Teachings of our Lord? As we head for another election these questions are not as crazy or immaterial as you might think. There are plenty of people who would say yes to those questions if only privately. My goal is not to tell you how to think politically. I leave that to your own conscience and your relationship with God. My hope is for you to prayerfully consider these questions and that you find this article interesting.

I am scandalized by many of my own colleagues who are confident they have the answer to this question. This translates both politically and theologically, as the two tend to go hand in hand. Our theology or faith as Christians should be informing our politics (as well as every aspect of our lives) and not the other way around. Where on one extreme there are those who emphasize righteousness and the other emphasizes "Social Justice". I find one side drifting further to the extreme, to where among a few of my own colleagues every sermon has a politically charged message. I also see it in their social media. I hear it in conversations. Given the political atmosphere of our nation this is becoming increasingly divisive. One political party now represents the "left" and the other the "right". Here is a way of understanding this fundamental difference in philosophy. Those on the right are deontological in their ethics. That means they believe in established rules, traditional values and traditional virtues. These things they believe are time tested truths and immutable with time and changes in culture. On the left there is the teleological ethic. This means goaloriented ethics. Teleos is Greek for goal or end. The idea is for a greater good and that is what is "right and good". Another way of saying it is "the ends justify the means". Part of this philosophy is utilitarian, which means the greatest good for the greatest number. The problem comes in a secular organization, how do you define "good"? Who and what are sacrificed for this stated goal? Is this a long or short-term good? In our postmodern society people are being taught truth and right are NOT absolute but relative, especially on the left. When derision replaces discussion and the left and right become divorced from one another the results are dangerous.

So returning to my original absurd question, the answer is: No! Things are not so black and white. Once you feel justified or believe you are more Christ like than your neighbor you have missed the mark. Once any of us think thinks we fully understand the mind of Christ we are mistaken. Our hope is in Christ and we need more of him. We need to place Jesus ahead and above politics, although we all must participate in governance. Government won't solve your problems and it can't bring about a utopian existence (especially socialism). Remember that government is made up of flawed humans.


